ANNUAL FALL CLEANUP DAYS

The City of Moxee will conduct our Annual Fall Cleanup Days Monday, November 21st for residents living South of Moxee Avenue, and Tuesday November 22nd for residents living North of Moxee Avenue. Fall Clean Up **will be limited to yard waste ONLY**. Yard waste will include leaves, tree branches, grass clippings, garden waste, etc. We ask that you please stack and organize your bags or boxes near the street or in the alley in a way that will make it easy for the City Crew to pick up. All items set out for disposal **must be bagged, boxed, or bundled**. We also require that tree limbs be bundled no longer than 6 feet. Due to the volume collected, we will only drive the route one time, so all yard waste must be out for pickup by 8:00 A.M. on your scheduled pickup day. If you have an elderly or disabled neighbor, you might consider helping them clean up their property. Let's make our community one we can be proud of.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM INFORMATION

As most people are aware, the City has taken ownership of the pressurized irrigation system. The 2022 irrigation season ended October 14, 2022. This past season there has been many issues pertaining to missing and or broken valves. Each connection to the system is controlled by an isolation valve that the City owns and it is used to isolate a resident if they have a break or a problem with their system. These valves are the City's and are not to be operated by the homeowner. Each homeowner should have their own valve that can be operated by the homeowner to shut off their system when repairs are needed. If your system does not have a valve, now is a good time to install one while the system is off. If you are unsure if your system has a valve, contact City Hall and we will be happy to assist you in installing one. The proper installation of valves helps to minimize the time the system is down for repairs by being able to isolate problems in the system. **Do not shut off or tamper with the City valve**, the system is designed to drain these valves back into the pipe to prevent damage from freezing. If you have any questions about your irrigation system, feel free to contact City Hall at 509-575-8851.

This 2022 irrigating season has seen considerable improvement with several households becoming compliant with the allotted 5 gallons per minute. This has improved the efficiency of the City's irrigating system as a whole. The City would like to see continued improvement and need your help in doing so. Check your irrigation systems to make sure your system is compliant with the 5 gallon per minute system allotment. If you have questions about this, please contact City Hall at 509-575-8851.

WINTERIZING TIP

Remember to disconnect your hoses from any hose bibs on your house or irrigation system. Leaving hoses connected does not allow the system to drain correctly and freezing could occur, damaging your plumbing system.

SNOW REMOVAL

Please remove your vehicles from the streets when it snows as stated in Ordinance #475, which states that during the months of November, December, January and February the Moxee City Police shall have the authority to order the owner or person in control of any vehicle parked on any public street to remove said vehicle from the street while snow removal operations are in effect.

FREE RECYCLING SERVICES

City customers who receive their garbage services through BDI are eligible for free curbside recycling. Recyclables are picked up the second full week of the month on Thursday. Contact City Hall at 509-575-8851 to order curbside recycling bins or check our website (cityofmoxee.us) for recycling pick up schedule.

DOG LICENSES / ANIMAL CONTROL

The City of Moxee requires all dogs over the age of four months to be licensed annually. It shall be unlawful to house, maintain or care for more than three domestic animals per residence, over the age of four months within the city limits of Moxee. The license fee for dogs is \$5.00 for a sterilized dog and \$11.00 for unsterilized and is valid from March 1st through February 28th. Licenses renewed after March 31st will be subject to \$10.00 late fee.

The City of Moxee does have a leash law that states “**no domestic animal shall be allowed to run at large at any hour of the day or night within City limits.**” Any animal so straying, entering or trespassing and not secured to a leash is declared a nuisance and shall be seized and impounded. Please be considerate when walking your dogs and go prepared to clean up any deposits that they may leave.

LOST OR FOUND DOGS

Please contact City Hall, 509-575-8851 to report any lost or stray dogs. Dogs that are picked up are held for 48 hours before being sent to an animal rescue organization. If you have lost a dog, contact City Hall to find out if it has been picked up by public works. Be sure to have all your dogs licensed so that the owner can be located.
