SPRING CLEANUP INFORMATION

To continue to keep our beautiful city clean and garbage free, our garbage collection service, for those residents that are serviced by Basin, is an unlimited pick-up plan. What does this mean? This means that you are permitted to put an unlimited amount of waste out at the curb for no additional charge every garbage pick-up day. This includes appliances without freon, furniture items, and up to 4 passenger vehicle tires per year(excludes truck or tractor tires).

Things to remember for garbage day.

1. Fill your cart and set it out at curbside by 5am on the day of pickup (or the night before).
 - *Bag up your trash/yard waste and place it into the cart for disposal. Make sure your cart is completely full before placing any additional items alongside. Once it's full, if you still have more waste for us to pick up, see Step #2.
2. Do you have extra stuff for us to pick up? Bag it, box it, bundle it!
 - *If your cart is full and you still have more waste for us to pick up, you can place it in qualified bins, bags, or bundles alongside the main cart for disposal. Just remember to follow these guidelines to avoid extra fees:
 - Waste must be properly "bagged, boxed or bundled" so that our crew members can lift it.
 - The weight must not exceed 65 lbs. per bag, box or bundle.
 - Place items 3 feet from your container so our workers can collect them.
 - The dimensions cannot exceed 2 feet by 2 feet by 3 feet.
 - If you use a personal garbage can or cart, make sure it's 32 gallons or less in size. Note that the 65-pound weight limit still applies.
3. Have something BIG to dispose of? Help us plan ahead.
 - *Our regular trucks are able to accommodate most large household items, such as old furniture or mattresses – just place them next to your cart at curbside like any other extra waste, and we'll pick them up.
 - However, certain items can't go directly into the waste stream because of potential health or environmental hazards. If you have one of the following items for us to pick up, please call Moxee City Hall at 509-575-8851 ahead of time to let us know that you have a Special item for disposal:
 - Televisions, Water Heaters, Large Appliances

GARBAGE SERVICE AND CONTAINERS

Customer shall keep their refuse containers clean to prevent odor and shall, at all times, maintain the location of the containers in a clean and sanitary condition. All customers shall place containers in the proper collection site no later than 5:00 AM on the day of collection; **after collection, the container shall be removed from the collection site and returned to the residence on the same day of collection.** Garbage totes and bins should not be filled beyond the top of the receptacle and the lid

should be closed at all times. If the container is filled beyond the top, the customers may be charged for an additional receptacle of the same or similar cost.

RECYCLING PROGRAM OFFERED TO BASIN DISPOSAL CUSTOMERS

City customers who receive their garbage services through Basin are eligible to add curbside recycling for a monthly fee. Recyclables are picked up the second full week of the month on Thursday. Contact City Hall at 509-575-8851 to order curbside recycling service. Check our website (cityofmoxee.us) for a recycling pick up schedule. **If you still have a recycling toter and do not want to pay for the recycling program, contact City Hall to have the recycling toter picked up.**

MOXEE IRRIGATION SYSTEM

The irrigation season usually runs from April 15th through October 15th. On April 10th, the system will begin being filled. Pressurizing of the system is scheduled to begin on April 15th. Be sure to check that all your irrigation valves and faucets are closed during this process to eliminate possible flooding of your property. Please contact the City of Moxee if you have a leak or other problems arise at 509-575-8851

DOG LICENSES / ANIMAL CONTROL

The City of Moxee requires all dogs over the age of four months to be licensed annually. It shall be unlawful to house, maintain or care for more than three domestic animals per residence, over the age of four months within the city limits of Moxee. The license fee for dogs is \$5.00 for a sterilized dog and \$11.00 for unsterilized and is valid from March 1st through February 28th. Licenses renewed after March 31st will be subject to \$10.00 per dog late fee.

The City of Moxee does have a leash law that states **“no domestic animal shall be allowed to run at large at any hour of the day or night within City limits.”** Any animal so straying, entering or trespassing and not secured to a leash is declared a nuisance and shall be seized and impounded. Please be considerate when walking your dogs and go prepared to clean up any deposits that they may leave.

LOST OR FOUND DOGS

Please contact City Hall, 509-575-8851 to report any lost dogs or dogs at large. Dogs that are picked up are held for 48 hours before being sent to the Humane Shelter. If you have lost a dog, please call to report it or to find out if it has been picked up by public works. Be sure to have all your dogs licensed so that we can locate the owner.

PARKING AND STORAGE OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

The City of Moxee receives a lot of questions regarding the parking and storage of recreational vehicles and boats. The following are excerpts from the Moxee Municipal Code.

It is unlawful for any person to park and or permit any other person to park an RV or utility vehicle so that it shall intrude into the improved public right of way or obstruct visibility from adjacent driveways or street corners.

Travel trailers, campers or motor homes may be parked in a residential area as long as the vehicle complies with the provisions of this title. The vehicle shall be kept in a side or rear yard and screening from the adjacent properties is encouraged. If the vehicle cannot be stored in a side yard or rear yard due to constraints, the vehicle shall be parked off site during those extended times when not in use.
